Statutory Notice

As you may have already seen in the school grounds or on the school website, Havering Council have today officially launched their statutory notice of school expansion for Brady Primary School. Everyone involved within the school is very excited about the expansion as it will give us the chance to let more children benefit from the excellent community school and ethos that we already have.

We are very proud of our school and it is our mission to help as many of the children and families in our local community as we can, with our focus being standards, teaching and learning and giving children memorable experiences and life chances.

The expansion is being planned and organised effectively between the school and the local authority to ensure that there is little to no disruption to the children's learning.

The revised timescale is for a new custom built nursery to open in September 2019, with the school growing year on year over the next 7 years to complete the expansion to 2 form entry.

This slow process is something myself and the Governors have insisted on to ensure that standards are kept high. Even at the end of these 7 years we will still be one of the smallest Primary schools in the borough of Havering.

School uniform

Just a quick reminder that after October half term Year 1– 6 will be going into our Winter uniform. This means that the polo T-shirts will be replaced with shirts and school ties. As always, a tie can be purchased in the school office or through our uniform supplier.
