













Up to 5 public libraries in Havering are at risk of closure, as the council seeks to address its £32.5m budget shortfall. Libraries under threat are crucial lifelines for many residents, as they provide books, access to computers, educational resources and also a safe space and social hubs for all.

Unions urge the council to explore other options before resorting to such drastic measures.

We know many councils including Havering are in financial crisis however, libraries do more than simply provide books, they're crucial to a range of residents, and a free service many rely on.

"The council shouldn't be choosing quick fixes without considering the harm to communities. There must be a rethink."

"The value libraries provide far outweighs the immediate financial savings, and the long-term social cost of closures will be profound.
